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Course Descriptions

DART 103 - Digital Animation Principles and Tools

3 units

2 hours lecture/3 hours lab

Credit, degree applicable

Transfer CSU

This is an introductory course in the basic principles and technology of digital animation. Students will develop an understanding of animation through the exploration of timing and movement via traditional animation methods, digital vector graphics, digital raster software and digital editing software to complete exercises and animated sequences. Students will also explore careers in animation through visiting professional lectures, and research into career paths and processes in the animation industry.

THEA 500 - Scene Study for the Older Adult

0.44 hours lecture

Noncredit

This fun and engaging course for older adults involves acting out dramatic and comedic scenes from film/television and theatre by notable writers. Emphasis is on dramatic analysis, memorization, movement, and discussion. This course meets the needs of many mature adults seeking to stay mentally, physically, and socially fit. Note: This course is open entry/open exit.

Programs of Study

Business Administration 2.0, AS-T

The business administration program is designed to provide students with a foundation in basic accounting principles, business law, and macroeconomics and microeconomics theory. Students will be able to apply methodologies to assess fiscal and monetary policy in the marketplace and understand the basics of contract law. A degree in business offers students a wide variety of entry-level career opportunities in accounting, management, marketing, and office administration. Upon successful completion of the program students will be prepared for entry-level careers and transfer to major in Business Administration. Competencies will be assessed through examination and projects.

The Associate in Science in Business Administration for Transfer (AS-T) is intended for students who plan to complete a bachelor's degree in a similar major at a CSU campus. Students completing the AS-T are given priority consideration for admission to the CSU system, but not to a particular campus or major. In order to earn an AS-T degree, students must complete:

- 1) Completion of 60 semester units or 90 quarter units that are eligible for transfer to the California State University.
- 2) Completion of California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC).
- 3) A minimum of 18 semester units or 27 quarter units in a major or area of emphasis, as determined by the community college district.
- 4) Obtainment of a minimum grade point average of 2.0.
- 5) A grade of "C" or ("P") or better in all courses required for the major or area of emphasis.

Students who have completed the AS-T will have a strong academic foundation in the field and will be prepared for upper division baccalaureate study at the university. The coursework will satisfy most of the lower-division requirements at many institutions within the California State University system. Students transferring to a UC, private, or out of state university should consult with an El Camino College counselor when planning to complete the degree since transfer requirements may be slightly different than those required for the AS-T.

Communication Studies 2.0, AA-T

The degree provides students with a foundation in the theory and practice of communication studies. This is achieved through courses that develop personal, business, and professional communication skills in individual, interpersonal, and group situations, along with research, organization, critical thinking, argumentation, and forensics skills. Students will demonstrate proficiency through performance, class projects, research papers, exams, critiques, and competitions. Students who complete the AA-T will have satisfied the lower-division Cal-GETC requirements at CSU's and UC's, have a strong foundation in the field, and be prepared for upper-division baccalaureate study. Students transferring to private or out-of-state universities should consult a counselor when planning to complete any requirements outside of the AA-T. Completion, student learning outcomes, transferability, forensic competitions, and program review measure program assessment.

The Associate of Arts for Transfer (AA-T) is intended for students who plan to complete a bachelor's degree in a similar major at a CSU campus. Students completing the AA-T are given priority consideration for admission to the CSU system, but not to a particular campus or major. In order to earn an AA-T degree, students must complete:

1. Completion of 60 semester units that are eligible for transfer to the California State University.
2. The California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) Requirements.
3. A minimum of 18 semester units in a major or area of emphasis, as determined by the community college district.
4. Obtainment of a minimum grade point average of 2.0.
5. A grade of "C" or better in all courses required for the major or area of emphasis.

Students who have completed the AA-T will have a strong academic foundation in the field and will be prepared for upper division baccalaureate study at the university. The coursework will satisfy most of the lower-division requirements at many institutions within the California State University system. Students transferring to a UC, private, or out-of-state university should consult with an El Camino College counselor when planning to complete the degree since transfer requirements may be slightly different than those required for the AA-T.
